Cave Description: This cave system runs parallel to Kays Walk and was accessed via a man hole in the roof of the main cave. The main, rectangular chamber has a debris filled entrance in it's western corner. A filled shaft in the roof is adjacent to the manhole entrance. There are two doorways in the north wall, one to an unexcavated cave, the other to a small chamber leading into the Malt kiln. The malt kiln is filled half way, but retains beam sockets and the stoke hole entrance. There is another unexcavated cave to the east of the malt kiln and in the north west corner of the second chamber. Both rectangular caves have holes in the roofs.

These are two large rectangular rooms connected by a passage and steps, leading down from the south east corner of the first cave. The first cave is higher than the second. In the north east corner of the upper chamber is a small 'antechamber'.</p>

Cave Description:

An extract from the Nottingham Date Book states that 'In an enclosure used as a garden for a number of years opposite Old Glasshouse Street near the Clayfields in this town, a discovery was made of a small dwelling house in the rock which has long been in ruins. The present owner, Mr John Flint, in company with his father's gardners, on digging the garden found a chimney which they supposed to belong to a house underground. Resolving to gratify their curiosity they removed several loads of earth and found a large room hewn out of the rock with a square pillar in the centre. In the fireplace was an old tobacco pipe as thick as a mans little finger and a small bar of iron. The room was nearly square, 6 by 7 yards and another room adjoined this one'. (The exact location of this house is unknown).
